WOMEN'S MARCH ON DENVER

I hope you were part of history in spirit or in person at the start of 2017. This was not a march of protest, rather was an opportunity for all participants to support social justice, human rights and equality. Marchers demonstrated their will to be vigilant in protecting these rights moving forward. All of those from BPW Colorado wore a yellow shash during our march. The Women's March on Denver was part of sister cities marching in solidarity for human rights sponsored by women, for everyone! On Saturday, January 21st in Denver was a 1.3-mile parade route ending with a rally at Civic Center Park.
